Dear Prof. Roy,

Thank you for publishing my article "Marketing of Science", in the March-April issue of *Science and Culture*. I am grateful to your editorial staff for the improvements made in my article, specially the drawings.

This excellent issue is very informative indeed. Of particular interest were your editorial on GM crops and the article by Kesavan and Swaminathan on the same subject. While you talked about the gains of farmers in many countries through GM crops you have also talked about absence of a sound risk assessment system and cost/benefit valuations. The article by Kesavan and Swaminathan raises more doubts when they write,—"the genetically engineered crops should be avoided as these are now known to produce 'unintended effects' and these are neither pro-nature, nor pro-poor, nor pro-women—etc".

Some ten years ago the Indian Association for Productivity, Quality and Reliability, Kolkata had organized an event on this subject in the National Library premises, financially supported by the DBT. Among over 200 delegates the majority were inquisitive farmers and representatives of the farming community. The then Minister of Agriculture and his Secretary who attended the workshop supported the case of GM seeds as did several speakers. However, there were others who strongly opposed. Most vocal were some NGOs and activists who while raising some valid questions said a lot of irrelevant things too. There were many questions to which nobody could give an answer (some were like what you have mentioned, 'what will happen after 14 generations ?) One said that if insects were repelled from a field with GM crops then the neighboring non-GM crops will be more severely attacked by the insects. The blanket opposition raised doubts in the minds of many and discussions remained inconclusive.

The March-April issue presented both sides of the debate so very well but, rightly, offers no firm conclusion. Eventually, the last word will come from the farmers only.

I could say somethings more in appreciation of the other articles also but in order to avoid this letter being too long I will stop here.
