SIR,

This is with ref. to 'Avermectin and Artemisinin: Weapons to Antiparasitic disease-free Tropical World'. Artemisinin as anti-malaria remedy has been introduced on the basis of "Ancient Chinese Medicine". I would like to point out that 'Artemisia cina' has been established as one of the remedies for 'Intermittent Fever' (Malaria) in the homoeopathic therapeutics more than 100 years ago. It has also been clinically verified. It may interest the readers to draw their attention to some more information about 'Artemisia cina', as in the British Homoeopathic Journal, Vol. 81,2/1992; I give it briefly here: The Chernobyl disaster occurred in April 1986. Beginning 1990 the Homoeopathic Centre (Ukraine) has been examining the

children who suffered due to the Chernobyl accident. The authors have under their homoeopathic care 54 children exposed to radiation after the nuclear disaster. Responses to homeopathic treatment especially in relation to general health was good. Cina was the most commonly indicated medicine (46%). The plant *Artemisia Cina* is locally (in the Ukraine) known as Chernobylnik or simply Chernobyl. . . .

I hope this information may interest those readers also who are not interested in Homoeopathy.
