INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

- Aims and Scope: Science and Culture is a multidisciplinary journal that provides a medium for publication of substantial and original articles, reviews and notes which focus on research and development in science, society and culture, national issues and events. This is a unique journal connecting the reflection of the community of Indian scientists and thinkers on the public understanding of science and culture together. The Indian Science News Association and the Editors of Science and Culture assume no responsibility for statements and opinions advanced by the contributors to the journal.
- ☐ Types of Contribution: Manuscripts which will subject to peer review, should take one of the following forms:

Articles, should be substantially original, definitive and describe a reasonably complete investigation with definite conclusion. For the benefit of the wide readership of the journal the article should preferably be written in non-technical language.

Research Communications, based on original investigation on any subject of topical interest and must contain previously unpublished information. This may include preliminary communication and work in progress.

Notes and News present the recent discovery, recent news on a current topic or event, and will be accepted for publication following discussion with the Editorial Board of the Journal.

Letters to the Editor containing comments related to articles previously published in the journal.

Book Reviews by invitation from the Editor-in-Chief.

Manuscript preparation: General: Manuscripts must be typewritten double-spaced with wide margins on one side of white paper. Good quality printouts with a four size of 12pt are required. Full postal and e-mail address must be given for all the coauthors. To expedite publication, the Editorial Board prefers to communicate with authors by e-mail. The Editors reserve the right to adjust style to certain standards of uniformity. Authors should retain a copy of their manuscript since we can not accept responsibility for damage or loss of papers.

Paper length: Articles should not ordinarily exceed 3000 words, Research Communications should not ordinarily exceed 1000 words and Letters to the Editor should not exceed 800 words.

Abstracts: An abstract of not more than 80 words must be supplied for all articles and research communications.

Text: Follow this order when typing manuscripts: Title, Authors, Abstract, Main text, Acknowledgements, Appendix, References, Figure Captions and then Tables. Headings should be in bold, subheadings in bold italics and subheadings in italics only. The affiliation of authors should be identified with asterisk and footnote.

References: All publications cited in the text should be presented in a list of references following the text of the manuscripts. In the text, relevant reference will be marked by the superscript numerals serially (e.g. Results are found to agree with synchrotron experiments of Jung et al.¹, but differs with theoretical results²). References should be given in the following form:

- 1. M. Jung, R. W. Dunford, D. S. Gemmell, E. P. Kanter, B. Krassig, T. W. Leburn, S. H. Southworth and Linda Young, *Phys. Rev. Lett.* **81**, 1596 (1998)
- 2. K. Gottfried, Quantum Mechanics, Vol. I, p.153, (1966) (Benjamin, New York).

Illustrations: An illustration should be provided in camera-ready from, suitable for reproduction (which may include about 30% reduction) without retouching. The width of all illustrations reproduced in a single column is 7 cm or less. Photographs, charts and diagrams are all to be referred to as "Figure(s)" and should be numbered consecutively in the order to which they are referred. They should accompany the manuscript, but should not be included within the text. All illustrations should be clearly marked on the back with the figure number and the author's name. All line drawings should be done in a white paper using black ink, lettering, graph lines and points on graphs should be sufficiently large and bold to permit reproduction when the diagram has been reduced to a size suitable for the journal. Original photographs (photocopies of photographs are not acceptable) must be supplied. A scale should be marked in the photograph when necessary. Figures may be published in colour, if this is judged to be essential. When colour figures are required, the author will be charged for colour printing at the current colour printing costs. All figures are to have a caption. Captions should be supplied on a separate sheet.

Tables: Tables should be numbered consecutively and given a suitable caption. Each table should be typed on a separate sheet, footnotes to tables, if any, should be typed below the table and should be referred to by superscript lowercase letters. No vertical rules should be used. Tables should not preferably duplicate results presented elsewhere in the manuscript (e.g. in graphs).

- □ Submission of Papers: All manuscripts complete in all respects should be submitted in **triplicate** to the **Editor-in-Chief** of the journal. An electronic version of the manuscript written in Microsoft Word must accompany the manuscript. Authors are specially requested to reduce the number of tables, illustrations and diagrams to a minimum.
- Reprints: No free reprints are allowed to the contributors of Research Communications and Letters to the Editor. 10 free reprints will be provided to contributors of Review articles who are either members of ISNA or have been invited to contribute article by the Editorial Board. Reprints can be ordered at a specially reduced rate at Rs. 200/- per page upto 25 copies and Rs. 150/- per page for subsequent 25 copies. Orders for reprints should be sent within 15 days after receiving the intimation of acceptance of each manuscript.

YOUNG SCIENTISTS AWARD PROGRAMME: 2008-2009

To encourage Young Scientists, The Indian Science Congress Association has introduced a number of awards in different disciplines in January 1981. These awards carry a sum of Rs. 25,000/- besides a Certificate of merit. These are 14 awards, one to be given in each Section.

- 1. Applications or nominations are invited from members (Life and Ordinary) of the Association who had paid their subscription on or before May 31, 2008. The upper age limit of the candidates for the award is 32 years as reckoned on December 31, 2007 (only those born on or after January 1, 1976 are eligible).
- 2. Four copies of full paper along with four copies of the abstract (not exceeding 100 words) shall have to reach the office of the General Secretary (Hqrs.) not later than May 31, 2008. At the top of each copy of the paper and its abstract, the name of the Section where the paper is to be presented should be indicated. The Sections are: 1) Agriculture and Forestry Sciences 2) Animal, Veterinary and Fishery Sciences 3) Anthropological and Behavioural Sciences (including Archaeology and Psychology and Educational Sciences) 4) Chemical Sciences 5) Earth System Sciences 6) Engineering Sciences 7) Environmental Sciences 8) Information and Communication Science and Technology (including Computer Sciences) 9) Materials Science 10) Mathematical Sciences (including Statistics) 11) Medical Sciences (including Physiology) 12) New Biology (including Biochemistry, Biophysics and Molecular Biology and Biotechnology 13) Physical Sciences and 14) Plant Sciences.
- 3. Four copies of the bio-data of the candidate including full name and address (with Phone, Fax and E-mail) alongwith the date of birth (duly supported by an attested copy of the certificate), research experience and membership number etc., should be appended to the full paper.
- 4. Work should have been carried out in India and this has to be certified by the Head of the Institution from where the candidate is applying.
- 5. The candidate should give an undertaking that the work which is being submitted has not been presented in any other Conference/Seminar/Symposium for consideration of any award.
- 6. In case of a paper by more than one authors, the candidate (young scientist) has to be acknowledged by the other author(s) (in terms of a certificate) as having made the major contribution. A Young Scientist could present only one paper in any one Section (and not a second paper with the same or related work in any other Section).
- 7. Full paper will be assessed for their content and at the most six Young Scientists in each section will be invited to make oral presentation of their papers in October. The selected scientists will be provided admissible travelling and daily allowances by the ISCA.
- 8. The final selection for the Awards will be done by a duly constituted committee and the awards will be given at 96th Indian Science Congress to be held from January 3-7, 2009.
- 9. The last date for receiving papers is 31st May, 2008.
