CHARLES DARWIN AND WORLD WAR II: AN EVOLUTION TOWARDS DARKNESS

Charles Darwin, after returning from his voyage in Beagle proposed the most powerful explanation of adaptive dynamics of the living world. The world judged the theory over 150 years and authorized it as the obvious natural rule. But Darwin when applied it to explain human society and its evolution, made some erroneous comments. A school of his supporters interpreted and implied his theory to establish selective superior inheritance and racial supremacy. That yielded Eugenics Movement and gradually fueled the Nazi fascism. In the present article that ill-development of the glorious triumph of Darwinian idea has been drafted to remind the darker side of that glory. It also tells us how the irresponsible explanation and implementation of any idea of that influence may threaten our existence.
